#### William H. Birmingham

William Birmingham was born February 25, 1898 in Buffalo, NY. Firefighter Birmingham was appointed to the Fire Department on March 17, 1917 at the age of 19. In 1921 he became an Engineer and in 1934 he was promoted to Captain. He was a Captain for 11 years before retiring August 15, 1945 after more than 28 years of service.

He was a veteran of WWI, where he served in France from 1918 to 1919. On June 7, 1958 at the age of 60 he suffered a heart attack and died, despite the efforts of the Fire Department, who responded to his home on North Avenue to treat him.

He was a member of Sacred Heart Church and the Loyal Order of Moose.

He was the brother of Niagara Falls Firefighters Frank Birmingham and Joseph D. Birmingham.



#### John J. Blake 1923-1961

John Blake was born June 10, 1894 in County Claire, Ireland. He came to Niagara Falls when he was 19 and was appointed as a Firefighter on January 24, 1923.

He worked for the New York Central Railroad until he was appointed to the Fire Department.

He was assigned to Firehouse 3 on Niagara Avenue.

After his retirement in 1961 he moved his family to Burbank, CA where he passed away at the age of 75 in 1970.

Edward M. Cassidy 1912-1918 1921-1948

Edward Cassidy was born September 21, 1884. He was appointed as a Firefighter on January 13, 1912. He resigned on March 1, 1918 but was reappointed December 15, 1921. He retired on January 1, 1948 with a combined total of 32 years with the Fire Department.

Firefighter Cassidy won a Bravery Award in 1946 for his assistance at a rescue at the Falls. His son Edward J. Cassidy won the Levy Award for a similar rescue many years later.

He was a member of the Holy Name Society and St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church. He was renowned as an athlete, playing football and baseball at St. Mary's High School. He also played for the Cataract Football Team and Electric City Nine.

He passed away on March 22, 1949.

#### **Thomas Conroy** (1894-1917)

Firefighter Conroy was born in Ottawa, Canada in approximately 1848 and moved to Niagara Falls at the age of ten. He lived an adventuresome life in the old Village of Niagara Falls and earned his living as a carpenter. He was one of the workers who helped erect Niagara University.

In 1871 he quit carpentry to come a tour guide in the Gave of the Winds, conducting sightseers along the lower Niagara River. He lived in a small house near the Maid of the Mist landing on the Canadian side of the river. It was here that he gained fame as a daring river rescue expert. He supported himself during this time as a trucker, hauling bricks for many of the buildings being constructed in early Niagara Falls.

As a river man, his daring was legendary and he was often called upon to enter the Rapids with a rope tied around him to make a river rescue. He later became a City Policeman and was considered a fearless patrolman who covered and made arrests in the "Tunnel" District, which was a well-known area of immigrants known for lawlessness.

In 1894, at the age of 46, he was hired as one of the original ten Firefighters when Niagara Falls formed a professional fire department. He had been a member of several volunteer companies and had earned his exempt status. He served 20 years at Headquarters and then four years at Engine 4 on Tenth Street.

In 1906 he made one of the most daring rescues ever recorded in Niagara Falls history by wading out 30 feet into the River, 15 feet from the brink of the Falls, to support the end of a ladder used by others to climb out and rescue a man who had been swept downriver. For this rescue he was awarded the Carnegie Medal and \$1,000.

Firefighter Conroy became ill in 1917 at the age of 69 while still a member of the Fire Department. After an illness of several months he passed away just days after his wife had died. He was a veteran, having served with the 42<sup>nd</sup> Separate Company. He was a member of the Elks, the Exempt Fireman's Association and St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church. He was survived by nine children.

#### Dennis R. Dinan

Born in Lewiston, NY around 1864, Firefighter Dinan came to Niagara Falls when he was a boy. He was appointed to the Fire Department June 1, 1894 as one of the original ten paid firefighters. He had been a member of the Cataract Hose Company on Second Street, which became Headquarters for the new City Fire Department.

On May 7, 1901 he was appointed to house foreman and was put in charge of the Third Street Firehouse. A few years later this position was changed to Captain. He remained in charge of Engine 2 for 20 years. Captain Dinan was a conspicuous figure who kept an immaculate personal appearance in his uniform. He had the respect and confidence of the men who worked for him, as well as his superiors in the Fire Department.

His parents were pioneer settlers of the old Village of Niagara Falls. His father was the caretaker of Oakwood Cemetery. Captain Dinan was a trained carpenter and worked that occupation before his appointment to the Fire Department. In 1921 he became ill with pneumonia and died on May 19<sup>th</sup> after a five-day illness. He was 58 years old and had over 26 years with the paid department. His two nephews, Gilbert and George Beck were City firefighters and his brother, William Dinan, was the first Chief of Police in Niagara Falls.

He was a member of St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church from childhood, the Knights of Columbus and the Exempt Fireman's Association. The flags at all City firehouses were placed at half mast upon news of his death.
